## Re-opening Pentraeth Primary School week beginning 29th of June

## Week 1 and 2 arrangements

The School will re-open to all children ,except for children of nursery age, on June 29th.Due to the social distancing rules of 2 m we obviously have to limit the numbers in each class. This is a period to get children back in to the swing of things and meet friends.The emphasis is on their wellbeing. It is also an opportunity fo us as a school to identify and resolve any health and safety problems that arise for next term, when we expand provision. For Year 6 pupils it's a time to prepare for transition to Secondary School as well as socializing.

A Care Center for the children of Key Workers will be open from 8am to 5 pm Monday to Friday. It will be held in the School hall. If the demand for places at the center increases above 8 then the Reception class will have to close as we do not have the capacity for more than 8 children and the Care Centre takes precedence. The health and safety of pupils and staff members are paramount .These arrnagements comply with the Welsh Government guidelines and recommendations. Take time to read the steps we will be taking, listed bellow ,before making a decision to send your child (ren) to school or not. Once you've done that , complete the questionnaire (one for each child) before 9am on Friday morning

- We will stagger the opening and closing times due to the nature of the building and the layout of the school's pathways. Adults and pupils will have to abide by the 2 m rule to ensure social distancing.
- Each child will attend 1 session (about half a day) each week for the first two weeks. We will be offering more hours over the following two weeks. All Anglesey Schools will follow a similar pattern depending on the capacity of the school.
- Each child will be in a group (social bubble).The groups will not change during this period.
- There will be 4 children in each group( social bubble) in the Reception Class and no more than 9 in in the remaining classes.
- Classes will be divided into 4 groups (social bubbles). One group (in each class) will be in each day for about half a day (see below) Monday to Thursday. The school will
be closed on Friday (except for the Key Worker Care Center) for thorough cleaning, rescheduling of resources, preparing packs, responding to children's work online etc.

Each child will attend 1 session (about half a day) each week for the first two weeks.
We will extend the hours over the last two weeks.

- Pupils of Key Workers will not be allowed to attend the center and attend a class session on the same day.
- Siblings will attend school on the same day (unless you ask us to do otherwise). You can drop off and collect your children at the same time if you wish. Please contact the school to arrange this.
- All classrooms, corridors and toilets will be thoroughly cleaned each afternoon.
- We have re arranged all classes and moved resources and furniture to create as safe an environment as possible for your child.
- There is a one way travel system around the school to ensure social distancing. The floors are clearly marked inside and outside.
- Desks are set 2 m apart and personal resources for each individual child will be available i.e. children will not be using the same pens, pencils and ruler as another child.
- Children will not be allowed to bring anything from home to school (only a coat and reading glasses)
- Pupils with asthma must bring a pump to keep in school - the pump will not go to and from school, it must remain at school.
- There will be separate toilets for each class ( 5 and 6 will use both male and disabled toilets). Children will go to the toilet one at a time. Pupils will wash their hands before and after going to the toilet with an approved soap. An adult will ensure that pupils do this and clean up after each child.
- We will take your child's temperature before they enter the building, a member of staff will wear full PPE when doing this. We will name the gadget Tommy Temperature and it will look like a puppet so as not to scare children. We will share a picture with you before the children start school.
- Each group (social bubble) will go out to play separately with adults in the class supervising. They will play games where they do not need to touch others.
- Children with a high temperature and / or with a cough will not be admitted to school. We suggest that you take your child's temperature in the morning before coming to school, to avoid disappointment.
- An adult (one only) must accompany a child / children to school, children will not be allowed to walk to school alone.
- All staff will wear plastic head shields and all will be decorated so as not to frighten children.
- Every child from 7 upwards will have their own personal hand liquid on the desk and we will practice hand hygiene on a regular basis.
- There will be hand gel dispensers at each entrance so that children clean their hands before and after playing out and on entry to and from school.
- When sending children to school a one way system must be followed by standing on the floor marks. We have staggered the start and collection times so that no more than 9 children arrive at any one time. Members of staff will be on duty to make sure everyone complies with the rules.
- If a child starts to show symptoms during the day we will contact parents / guardian immediately and put a child to sit comfortably in a separate room.

Online packs will continue and teachers will respond to the work following the current procedures.

Whether you decide to send your child(ren) to school or not will be your choice, there will be no fine if you choose not to .More details will be shared on Friday after we receive your questionnaires.
